

Preparation of Abstracts for Attosecond Physics 2009 (second line of title if needed)

Synopsis Please replace this text with a brief synopsis of, say, 100 words or less. We intend to handle the abstracts automatically, so please include at least the appropriate Author and Title metadata in your document. Please copy your synopsis into the Subject metadata field as well. In Word, these metadata fields are found in the "Document Properties". In TeX, they can be added with a pdf metadata package, an example of which can be found near the top of the example abstract TeX template.

This is a sample abstract for Attosecond Physics 2009 in Manhattan, Kansas, USA. Accepted abstracts will be available in printable PDF format at least one month before the conference at the conference website. A CD containing all the accepted abstracts will be distributed to registered participants at the conference.

1. Abstracts should be written in English. The length of each abstract is strictly limited to one page. The abstract should be submitted in PDF format through the conference web site. Files larger than 5 Mb will be rejected.

2. When submitting your abstract, you can examine how it will look online before you continue with the submission. It is your responsibility to check that the abstract is correctly **formatted** and **readable**. No changes to the submitted abstracts will be made by the conference organizers.

3. Abstracts should be in A4 format (210 mm × 297 mm, i.e., 8.268 inches × 11.693 inches). All text and figures must fit within side, top, and bottom margins of 2 cm. Use 11-pt Roman (LaTeX) default font or a similar font such as Times New Roman throughout the abstract.

4. The title should be typed in 14-pt boldface letters and centered. If necessary, use a second line, single-spaced just below the first.

5. Leave two lines before the names of the authors and again before the single-spaced affiliations and addresses.

6. The abstract must have a short (at most 700 characters long) synopsis that is 16 cm wide. Use 0.75-cm spaced lines with 9-pt Roman font

for the synopsis. After leaving two lines, the body text is typed in two-column format with 0.75-cm column separation. The text should be single-spaced and the first line of each paragraph should be indented 3 spaces.

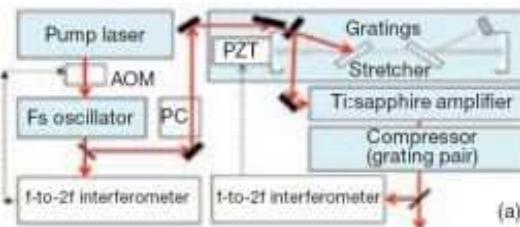


Fig. 1. Schematic of the laser system.

7. Figures will be shown in color on the web and on the CD. Give each figure a separate caption and, like a table caption, it should be concise (see Fig. 1). If you choose to submit color figures remember that most printouts from the web will be in black and white. It is your responsibility to ensure that the figures are easy to read and understand even in grayscale mode.

8. References in the text should be indicated using numerals in square brackets [1]. The list of references in 9-pt size letters follows the last line of the text with one extra line inserted. Follow the style used in Physical Review A.
